## GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE MAKING ENTRIES, ALSO READ THE HORSE SHOW COMPETITION AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUR EVENT.

### 2010 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following general terms and conditions are general in nature and apply to all departments on the Colorado State Fair grounds. Please be sure to you read all information prior to attending the 2010 Colorado State Fair.

Competitions are open to the world except where otherwise specified. The Colorado State Fair Management will use diligence to insure safety of exhibits after arrival and placement but, in no case will the State Fair Authority be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury of any character to any property while on grounds or at any time or place, nor be liable for or make any payment for the value thereof. Presentation of entry form by the exhibitor shall be deemed acceptance of all competition requirements and the exhibitor thereby indemnifies the Colorado State Fair from any and all legal proceedings in regard thereto.

**WARNING:** Under Colorado Law, an equine professional is not liable for any injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to section 13-21-119 Colorado revised statutes.

No animal or article will be entitled to a place on the grounds until proper entry has been made. All entries must be made on regulation forms, properly filled out and accompanied by all fees whenever required. There is no outside bedding allowed on the Colorado State Fairgrounds unless otherwise told. The Colorado State Fair Management has made it mandatory for all exhibitors to purchase their animal bedding through the Colorado State Fair Feed/Bedding Concessionaire. If you choose to violate this competition requirement and bring your own bedding, you will be asked to remove it from the grounds immediately. This competition requirement will be highly enforced by the Feed/Bedding Concessionaire and the Colorado State Fair Management team.

The Colorado State Fair Management shall reserve the right to limit entries to facilities available and cancel any division or class in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition. Any return of entries under this competition requirement will be done on a non-decimator basis.

The Colorado State Fair Management may reserve the right to vacate, as ineligible for competition, and order the removal of any entry, which has been entered in violation of these competition requirements.

Exhibits may not be removed prior to the time listed within each department. Release forms are required for the protection of the exhibitor.

The Colorado State Fair assumes no responsibility for errors in entry. Every animal and article shall be entered and exhibited in the name of the bona fide owner.

It is the policy of the Colorado State Fair Commission to provide all persons the opportunity to exhibit at the Fair without regard to race, creed, color, sex, age, or other non-merit factors. Laws and policies of this Commission prohibit discrimination for or against any person because of any of these non-merit factors.

All premium checks must be cashed by Dec. 31 of the current year. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** No refund checks less than \$5.00 will be issued.

All payments received in the horse show department will be ran through the bank in a timely manner. Under no circumstance are you allowed to cancel check payments without permission from a state fair official, followed by written documentation from a vet or doctor, explaining why you can't attend.

**PROTESTS:** Unless otherwise specified in the department competition and entry requirements, three individuals must file a written and signed protest with the Colorado State Fair Management within 24 hours after the occasion for a protest or alleged violation. The protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint and be accompanied by a \$150.00 cash deposit or certified check, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Upon receipt of a properly presented protest, the Colorado State Fair Department Manager will appoint a committee of three disinterested, qualified persons to review the protest and render a decision, which shall be considered final. The full deposit will be refunded if protest is sustained. Neither a member of a review committee, the Colorado State Fair Authority nor Management will be held liable for any decision or penalty invoked as a result of the protest. Judges decisions are final with no appeal considered.

**DISPUTES:** The Colorado State Fair Management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the Competition requirements and Regulations, and to arbitrarily settle questions of differences.

**CONCESSIONS AND ADVERTISING PRIVILEGES:** All exhibits, concessions, and/or commercial privileges are at the sole discretion of fair management. Under no circumstances will any advertising matter be allowed to be placed upon buildings, trees or other places on the grounds or otherwise distributed without management permission.

**THE PRESS:** News media services are available for obtaining reports of Judges, awards, daily programs, special orders and announcements, official decisions, and all Colorado State Fair matters of interest or value to the public.

**SHIPMENT OF EXHIBITS:** Shipped exhibits should be sent to the exhibitor in care of the Colorado State Fair, 1001 Beulah Ave., Pueblo, CO 81004. Express charges, as well as freight charges must be prepaid.

**MAIL:** Parties wishing to have mail sent to them at the Fairgrounds may have it addressed to them in care of the Department in which they are participating, "Colorado State Fair, 1001 Beulah Ave., Pueblo, CO 81004," and call for any mail at the on grounds Butler Supply Building, located on the south wall between gate 1 and gate 2.

**IRS:** In order to comply with the State of Colorado and the International Revenue Services, A PROPERLY COMPLETED IRS FORM W-9 MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH EACH COMPETITIVE ENTRY, when applicable. When completing the IRS Form W-9 that is included in this entry information, please be sure to carefully read and follow the form's instructions. **NOTE:** Failure to submit a W-9 form will hold up payment of any premium monies you won at the Colorado State Fair.

**CAMPING:** On-ground camping is limited to pre-paid reserved camping spots only! No camping or overnight or stays allowed in any parking lot or barn areas of the Colorado State Fair.

**DOGS:** No Dogs are allowed on the Colorado State Fairgrounds other than those on a leash for direct competition or Service animals. See individual departments for Competition Requirements.

**MOTORIZED UTILITY VEHICLES:** See Special provisions for each individual department.

## 2010 COMPETITION AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE HORSE SHOW DEPARTMENT

**ENTRIES:** Entries will open on **Monday, June 7, 2010**. All horse show entries will close **Friday, August 6, 2010** unless otherwise stated. The Post Office postmark will be accepted over meter when both are present. Exhibitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their Agents in preparation of entries. All fees must accompany entries. Open checks will not be accepted unless otherwise stated. Any exhibitor issuing a check for payment of entries, stall, or passes which does not clear their account for any reason will have (5) five days in which to make payment to keep entries eligible to participate in the Colorado State Fair, with a \$20.00 additional charge assessed. Parking passes and gate passes may be picked up during regular horse show office hours beginning Monday, August 9, 2010.

Entries should be made out on official 2010 Colorado State Fair entry forms, and accompanied by fees and all necessary papers (association member cards and complete copies of registration papers showing current owner). If the entry is received missing any of the above items and is returned back to the Colorado State Fair after the August 9, 2010 deadline, a late entry fee may be charged.

All exhibitors and/or horse owners of which the premium monies are to be given to must fill out a W-9 form prior to receiving their back numbers. The W-9 form must have that person's legal tax id name and physical address of which you file your income taxes under. If one chooses to receive premium monies in a corporate or ranch name all tax information must be correct on the W-9 in order for the Colorado State Fair Accounting office to accept the W-9 form.

The Colorado State Fair Management reserves the right to decline or accept entries at any time without statement of reason. No telephone entries will be accepted.

Entries can be paid for by check, money order, cashier check, visa, or mastercard.

**LATE ENTRIES:** Late entries will be accepted, but the exhibitor will have to pay a penalty of up to \$100 per show entered. A late entry is any entry received after the post-marked date of August 6, 2010. Late entries must be made in the Horse Show Office no less than 24 hours prior to the scheduled time of the class, unless otherwise stated.

**POST ENTRIES:** Post entries will be accepted with no charge as long as the horse or horses are already entered in other classes. Any classes added after August 6, 2010 is considered a post entry as long as the horse was previously entered prior to August 6, 2010.

**SUBSTITUTIONS AND CANCELATIONS:** Substitutions and cancelations must be approved through the Colorado State Fair Horse Show Management. All substitutions or cancelations must be in writing (fax acceptable (719) 561-2035). Vet-outs: Any vet-out received after August 20, 2010, will have entry fees only returned. Vet-outs prior to August 16, 2010 will receive entry fees, stall fees, and cattle fees only returned. The Colorado State Fair does not return office charges, parking passes, or gate passes purchased prior to vet-out. Exhibitors cancelling entries without a veterinarian certificate shall forfeit all fees. Once horse is on Colorado State Fair grounds the vet-out must come from the official Colorado State Fair Veterinarian. All vet-out certificates must be turned into the Horse Show office by the last day of the division in which the horse is competing. Riders and handlers may be substituted at any time provided the change has been made in the horse show office, prior to the start of the class and the rider/exhibitor meets all membership eligibility requirements. Refunds are the sole discretion of the Horse Show Manager. No refunds will be made on accounts less than \$5.00.

**NUMBERS:** All entry form data must be completely and accurately completed before each horse will be assigned a number. The number must be clearly displayed by the exhibitor whenever the horse is in the ring, and in accordance with breed association or federation rules. No exhibitor may be able to pick up their numbers without all proper entry information filled, all fees paid for, and a completed W-9 on file with the horse show office.

**STALL REQUESTS:** Stall requests/assignments will be based on the date the stall reservations and complete payment is received. When requested stalls are no longer available, the show management will notify the exhibitor or owner to let them know where their stalls will be. Stall fees **do not** include first bedding.

**STALL ASSIGNMENTS:** Stall assignments will be available at the Horse Show Check-In Station upon arrival at the fairgrounds. The Horse Show Check-In Station will be open 7:00am-9:00pm. Arrival at any other times may result in a delay in receiving stall assignments and bedding. Please call ahead if you plan to arrive after 9:00pm. (719) 240-2096

**ARRIVAL and RELEASE:** Arrival and release times are listed with each show. Exhibitors need to check this schedule carefully as horses will only be admitted on grounds only at these scheduled times. Exhibitors must obtain a release from the horse show office in order to take stock off the grounds. Exhibitors are asked to remove horses after they have finished their show they were competing at. Diseased or injured animals may be removed from grounds upon recommendation of attending veterinarian and released signed by the Horse Show Management.

**ENTRY OFFICE HOURS:**

The Colorado State Fair Horse Show Office will be open Monday, June 7, 2010 to August 24, 2010 daily from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Beginning August 27, 2010, Entry Office will open one hour before the first class of the day and remain open until (30) thirty minutes after the last class of each day.

All horse show entry business must be conducted during these hours.

**STALLIONS:** Junior exhibitors will not be allowed to ride, drive, or handle stallions in any class except as provided for in breed division rules. Stallions may not be shown in AQHA Novice Amateur classes.

Colorado State Fair reserves the right to use exhibitor and livestock images, portraits, and likeness as captured by official CSF photographers for promotions, advertising, and marketing endeavors.

**RV and Camping Reservations:** All RV and camping reservations must be made through the Facility Management. The Horse Show office does not accept any RV and Camping reservations. Please contact the Colorado State Fair Facility Management to reserve camping and RV reservations. The number to the Colorado State Fair Facility Management is **(719) 404-2023**.

**PARKING:** Horse trailers will not be permitted in the stall area except for the purpose of unloading and loading. All trucks and trailers must be attended at all times while inside the horse show area. All trailers must be parked in the specified trailer parking area, known as the "Greyhound Parking Lot" it is located five miles off grounds. This is a secured parking lot. Vehicles only will be allowed to be parked in the Horseman's Lot (as space permits). Additional vehicle parking will be issued South Lot stickers. A free shuttle service is available for those parking in the south lot. Day Haul parking is available for exhibitors who come for the day and remain hooked up. This lot is located through Gate 8 directly behind the Grandstand Arena. This lot has limited space and is time restrictive. Space is available on a first come first serve basis. Please call the Horse Show Office for dates and times spaces are available.

**PREMIUMS:** Premiums will be paid following the Fair and all premium checks will be mailed to owners or exhibitors as reflected on the W-9 forms and registration papers initially submitted. **NO CHECKS WILL BE MAILED WITHOUT A W-9 FORM COMPLETELY FILLED OUT AND FILED WITH THE CSF HORSE SHOW DEPARTMENT.** Premiums will be calculated according the Horse Show Sliding Scale, unless otherwise stated. Ribbons will be presented to the first six places unless otherwise stated. All around awards will be presented in each show, unless otherwise stated.

The Colorado State Fair Management may, at its discretion, expel any person or persons abusing any horse on the Horse Show grounds at any time, and entry fees and prize money will be forfeited. National breed associations will be notified of any abuses and appropriate disciplinary action recommended. By submitting an entry, an exhibitor agrees to submit any horse to drug testing procedures either by an association appointed or State Fair appointed veterinarian.

Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the Officials on the part of the owner, groom, driver or rider, of any horse on exhibition will disqualify such horse for adjudication and the exhibitor shall forfeit all fees. Further action may be taken at the discretion of the Horse Show Manager.

Any horse doctored, or in any way improperly or unfairly prepared or tampered with before going into the show ring, will be disqualified. The show ring will be under absolute control of the Colorado State Fair Horse Show Management. Only qualified persons will be allowed in the ring during judging.

**HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:**

**OUT OF STATE ORIGIN:**

- 1.) **2010 NEW HEALTH CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS** - Required and must be provided to the Official Colorado Department of Agriculture State Veterinarian's at time of arrival and must be no more than 5 days old prior to day of arrival to the State Fairgrounds. **The Colorado State Vet's have the right to change the health requirements prior to the start of Fair if there is a disease outbreak in Colorado or in the Neighboring states. Please check the Colorado State Fair website prior to coming to see if the Health Requirements have changed.** Horses entering grounds will be subject to examination by the State Veterinarian's office. Any animal found showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases may be immediately withdrawn from the show and held in quarantine at owner's risk and

expense until properly treated and recovered, or until properly released in order to return to owner's premises following treatment.

- 2.) NEGATIVE test for Equine Infectious Anemia (AGID or ELISA) required and must be provided to the Official State Veterinarian's for the Colorado State Fair at time of arrival, and must be dated no more than one (1) year from date of arrival.

**COLORADO ORIGIN:**

- 1.) HEALTH CERTIFICATE required and must be provided to the Official Colorado Department of Agriculture State Veterinarian at time of arrival and must be no more than 5 days old prior to day of arrival to the State Fairgrounds. **The Colorado State Vet's have the right to change the health requirements prior to the start of Fair if there is a disease outbreak in Colorado or in the Neighboring states. Please check the Colorado State Fair website prior to coming to see if the Health Requirements have changed.** Horses entering grounds will be subject to examination by the State Veterinarian's office. Any animal found showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases may be immediately withdrawn from the show and held in quarantine at owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until properly released in order to return to owner's premises following treatment.
- 2.) Equine Infectious Anemia – No test required.

**VESICULAR STOMATITIS (VSV):** Annual notices on Vesicular stomatitis will be issued prior to the event as requested by the Colorado State Veterinarian's Office. We appreciate all exhibitors' participating in state mandated policies.

**EQUINE HERPES VIRUS (EHV):** Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to temperature-test all horses on a regular and daily basis. In the event of a sudden temperature increase, exhibitors should notify the show office immediately to arrange for a quarantine stall for observation. Annual notices on EHV will be issued prior to the event as requested by the Colorado State Veterinarian's Office. We appreciate all exhibitors' participating in state mandated policies.

**BRAND REQUIREMENTS:**

A.) Out of State Exhibitors

- 1.) All livestock coming from mandatory brand inspection states must have a current brand inspection certificate. The original copy of the inspection certificate must be presented with the health papers at time of arrival. All animals found to be improperly shipped will be held until released by the state of origin.
- 2.) All out of state exhibitors coming into Colorado for the Colorado State Fair from Non-Mandatory Inspection States must show whether for exhibition or sale. Legal proof of title would be any of the following:
  - i. Registration Papers
  - ii. Legal bill of sale properly witnessed. The requirements of a legal bill of sale are:
    - \* Seller's name;
    - \* Buyer's name;
    - \* Complete description of stock being purchased (the complete description should include the number of head, color, sex, breed markings, registration numbers, and hot brands).
    - \* Signature of seller;
    - \* Signature of buyer, and
    - \* Notarized affidavit stating that the animal(s) being transported and/or exhibited are of your raising.

**EXHIBITOR BADGE AND PARKING PASSES:**

A. Horse Exhibitor Badge

1. Cost is \$15.00 for an Adult 5 Day and \$10.00 for a Youth 5 Day
2. Includes general admission for any 5 days during the fair
3. Does not include vehicle parking

B. Parking Passes:

1. Cost is \$30.00 for a 5 Day Horseman's lot or \$10.00 for a 1 Day Horseman's Lot.
2. Cost of Day Haul Parking in Lot 8 is \$10.00 per day. This pass is time restrictive and date restrictive. This Lot is available on September 1-2, and 5-6 from 5am – 3pm. Available August 27-31<sup>st</sup> but must be out by 1 pm. Lot 8 is NOT available on September 3-4.
3. Pass includes parking for that day and general admission for the Driver Only.

**EXHIBITOR BADGE AND PARKING PASSES CONTINUED...**

4. Passes must be visible in vehicle so as to be read from the exterior at all times.
5. Vehicles not possessing correct or expired permits may be towed at owner's expense. No exceptions.

6. Vehicles not parked in the correct parking space or lot may be towed at owner's expense. No exceptions

### HORSE SHOW SLIDING SCALE

Premiums paid on the SLIDING SCALE will be paid the amount noted below. Amounts will be determined by the number of entries ACTUALLY SHOWN. Premium checks will be mailed to owners/exhibitor based on the address given on the W-9 form. Classes with more than 35 entries will be paid a purse totaling \$9 per entry plus \$150 based on the following percentages: 29%, 24%, 19%, 14%, 9%, and 5% for places 1st - 6th. NO CHECKS WILL BE MAILED WITHOUT A W 9 ON FILE.

## 4H HORSE SHOW AUGUST 27-29, 2010

All 4-H Youth Exhibitors and their parents are required to read all of the Colorado State Fair General Terms and Conditions, as well as; the Horse Show Competition and Entry Requirements and the section of 4-H Rules prior to coming to the 2010 Fair. All 4-H Youth Exhibitors must complete an entry form which must be signed by the county agent and a parent or legal guardian. Entry forms not filled out completely will be returned to the exhibitor. Accepted entries may make class changes and/or adds at the state fair as long as the changes or adds are within their original division and signed off by one of the 4-H State Fair Superintendents. Late Entries are not accepted at the 4-H horse show. Entries must be paid for in full and post marked by August 6, 2010. Exhibitors who have to travel a considerable distance must make arrangements with the Colorado State Fair Horse Show Management prior to coming to fair. Dormitories: reservations for Camp Tobin Dorm must be made by your county extension agent through the State 4-H Office. Camping/RV reservations must be made ahead of time through the Colorado State Fair Facility Management Office. See Horse Show Competition and Entry Requirements for more information.

All 4-H Youth Exhibitors upon arrival must provide the State Veterinarians with a current Health Certificate that is date specific according to the State Vet Health Requirements (State Vet Health Requirements are located on the Colorado State Fair Website under the Horse Show Premium Book Section). All exhibitors must present their horse's health papers at gate 6 where the State Vets will be set up. If you fail to have a current health paper on your horse or your health papers are beyond specified date required, you may purchase a health paper from the State Vets at their desired cost. For more information regarding Health Requirements please refer to the State Vet's Health Requirements link on the Premium Book page.

## 4-H HORSE SHOW AUGUST 27-29, 2010

### 4-H HORSE SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Eligibility: Exhibitors in this department must be members in good standing of a Colorado 4-H Club. Exhibitors who are at least 8 years of age and have not reached their 19th birthday as of January 1 of the current year will be eligible. All entries made in this department are subject to the Colorado State Fair Horse Show Competition and Entry Requirements. Entry forms must be signed by the county extension agent. The Colorado State Fair Horse Show is a 4-H show and not an open or FFA horse show. All entry forms must be signed by a 4-H County Extension Agent and a parent or legal guardian to certify that the entry is a bona fide project of the exhibitor's 4-H horse program. All exhibitors must have completed Colorado Horse Project Advancement Level II, Western to be eligible to compete in the Western Division, Working Ranch Horse Level II to compete in the Ranch Horse Division and/or Advancement Level II English to compete in the English Division of the State 4-H Horse Show. 4-H members must have passed the appropriate Level III rating to enter Western Riding, Reining, Hunt Seat Equitation over fences, Hunter Hack, and Ranch Horse (roping). Entrants in the Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences and Hunter Hack classes must have passed the Hunt Seat level III Advancement levels test to ride their horse over fences (i.e. Dressage/Saddle Seat Level III card holders are not eligible to enter over fences classes). Specific state and national contest rules must be observed in addition to the above rule.
2. Ownership is not required in the State 4-H Horse Show, but the exhibitor must have had the major responsibility for the management, care and training of the horse during the club year. The county agent's signature on the entry blank should attest to this fact.
3. Exhibitors are required to wear their number at all times while in the horse show area. While showing, exhibitors are encouraged to display their number on both sides of the saddle pad versus on the exhibitor's back (exception: Showmanship). Two copies of each contestant's number will be provided by the show management. An exhibitor entering the arena without a number on will NOT be placed.
4. The show is divided into four separate point counting divisions: English, Western, Working Ranch Horse and Gymkhana. Exhibitors may compete in any or all divisions. Exhibitors may not switch divisions after the August 6th deadline. Individual classes in each division are divided by age in such a manner as to best equalize class size. Ages are determined as of January 1 of the current year.
  - a. In ALL divisions, the written test and showmanship are considered regular classes and will be counted toward high point awards. As the written test is considered a class, exhibitors must be on time to take the test, bring their own pencil, must have their exhibitor number, be dressed appropriately and include all necessary information on their score sheet (name, 4-H age, exhibitor number). Any score sheets without necessary information will be discarded. Exhibitors who arrive late for the test will lose the opportunity to take the test. The only adults allowed in the testing area are those proctoring the test. Exhibitors must direct any questions to test proctors. Exhibitors will be asked to forfeit their test and leave the area if they share answers with others. Every effort will be made to provide written tests with only one possible correct answer per question. The protest of any questions or the answer to any question must be made by the exhibitor. Once the last exhibitor has completed their exam, the key to the exam will be posted and made available to all contestants. From the time the key is posted, exhibitors will have exactly 1 hour to protest the answer(s) to any question(s). Once the hour has expired, the test results are FINAL and NO CHANGES will be made under any circumstances. Exhibitors for Division Champion Awards in both English and Western divisions must take the written test and compete in showmanship in both divisions. The junior written test on the English and Western days will be administered 10 minutes after the completion of the final junior Showmanship class. The senior written test on the English and Western days will be administered 10 minutes after the completion of the final senior Showmanship class.
5. Exhibitors may bring a total of two (2) horses regardless of how many divisions they choose to enter with the exception of the Working Ranch Horse division. Exhibitors are restricted to one entry per class. Exhibitors participating in the Working Ranch Horse Division are only allowed to enter and ride one horse throughout the entire division.
6. No horse may be shown by more than one exhibitor.
7. All horses entered in any division must be included in the exhibitors Horse Project Record Book and declared as a project horse as of June 1 of the current year. No substitution of horses will be permitted under any circumstances unless the substitute horse meets the above requirements.
8. Awards: Most class awards will be presented at the arena gate following the completion of the class. Ribbons not picked up at the gate may be claimed at the 4-H Horse Show Information booth or at the Horse Show Office. Awards will not be mailed. High point individual awards will be presented following the completion of each division. Exhibitors are required to be in proper attire when accepting their awards.

9. **To be eligible for the 2010 4-H Division Champion awards, the 4-H member may compete in the following classes:**

**\*\*2010\*\*** A contestant may enter any and all of the classes in a single division that he /she are qualified to enter. However, 4-H members must have passed the appropriate Level III rating to enter Western Riding, Reining, Ranch Horse (individual cow work- rope), Hunt Seat Equitation over Jumps and Hunter Hack.

Written test, Showmanship, and Horsemanship/Equitation are required for a contestant to be eligible for western or English high point awards. **All four classes are required for a contestant to be eligible for a ranch horse division high point award** and the written test is required to be eligible for a gymkhana high point award.

10. It is required that all events be held inside a closed arena. During all runs, arena gates will remain closed. Failure to enter and leave the arena, mounted at a walk or trot results in a disqualification. Only participating contestants, arena crew, and officials should be in the arena.

11. No stallions are permitted in 4-H classes.

12. Exhibitors will not be permitted to directly approach judges under any circumstances. Any and all questions or comments must be directed through show management.

13. Exhibitors and/ or parents or guardians will be disqualified and excused from the grounds for any unsportsmanlike conduct or abusive action to a horse at the discretion of show management. Mounts must be under control at all times and handled in a safe manner. Any exhibitor not adhering to the above rule will be disqualified. All fees, prize money and awards will be forfeited.

14. Rule 1, Rule 20 and 21 in the Colorado 4-H Rule Book will be strictly enforced.

15. **EXHIBITORS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAKING THEIR CLASS. THE EXHIBITOR MUST ENTER THE RING ACCORDING TO THE ORDER OF GO IN THE TIME SPECIFIED BY SHOW MANAGEMENT. FAILURE TO DO SO WILL DISQUALIFY THE EXHIBITOR FROM THE CLASS. ANY GATE CALLS ARE COURTESY CALLS ONLY!**

16. Time permitted for tack changes will be at the discretion of the paddock master and show management.

17. The Colorado State Fair 4-H Horse Show Management reserves the right to amend or change rules, combine classes and change times of scheduled classes at any time prior to the judging and due notice will be given exhibitors of any changes.

18. Ties: Scores of the written test will be used to break all ties. In the event a tie still exists, placing in the respective showmanship class will be used. If a tie still exists, duplicate awards will be presented.

19. During cattle classes, only the stock contractor, his employees or State Fair Officials will be allowed in the cattle chute area.

20. Colorado State Fair 4-H Horse Show Management and Superintendents reserve the right to randomly or directly drug test any horse on the grounds at any time for forbidden substances. If forbidden substances are found to be administered to any horse at any time during the Colorado State Fair 4-H Horse Show, exhibitors and horses will be disqualified from all classes and will forfeit any and all premium money. For a list of forbidden substances, please refer to the "forbidden substances" section of the current AQHA Rulebook.

21. The state fair board has determined to not require Premises ID's for the 2010 4-H horse show exhibitors, but they are strongly suggesting that we encourage exhibitors to acquire a premise ID number. Premises ID Registration information will be available on the grounds during the 2010 State Fair 4-H Horse Show. You may also actively register your premises at **www.nais.com**.

22. As always, all horses are required to have a health certificate upon entry to the Colorado State Fair Horse Show Grounds.

23. Horse shavings will be available on the State Fair Horse Show Grounds. Outside shavings are prohibited.

24. Only contestants are allowed to school and or ride their horses at any time while at the State Horse Show.

25. Contestants are strongly encouraged to follow the 4-H dress code at all times. Contestants will be asked to modify their dress to meet State Dress code. Acceptable dress rules and expectations can be found from your local Extension office.

## **WORKING RANCH HORSE DIVISION RULES**

The Working Ranch Horse Division will be conducted following the rules published in the 2009 State 4-H rule book.

1. 4-H Exhibitors may only use one horse for all the Working Ranch Horse Classes.
2. 4-H Exhibitors entering in the Working Ranch Horse Division will automatically be entered in every Working Ranch Horse Class offered including the Working Ranch Horse Written Test.
3. If an exhibitor chooses not to compete in one of the Working Ranch Horse classes, they will forfeit their eligibility to compete for any of the High Point Awards within this division.
4. To compete in the Working Ranch Horse Division all riders must hold a Working Ranch Horse Level II card or Level III card to rope live cattle.
5. During the Trail class a 3 minute gate call will be used. Failure by contestant to report in a timely manner will result in a no-score. Activities in East and West areas will take precedence over trail classes, however consideration will be given to contestants in other classes. It is your responsibility to report this class conflict to the trail gate person. Although we may start on the next age group, the intent is that all Trail contestants for a specific age group will be completed before the next age group begins.

### **Classes Offered and Descriptions**

**Ranch Horsemanship** – Refer to the 2009 State 4-H rule book for descriptions. Pattern will be from 2009 State 4-H rule book. (Look at the Ranch Horsemanship Pattern, don't go by the wording on how to perform it. Exhibitors will not have to ground tie or rope in this class.)

**Ranch Trail** - Refer to the 2009 State 4-H rule book for descriptions. Pattern and obstacles will be provided by State Fair. Youth will receive a whistle and will be required to stop the pattern if at any time the rope is considered to be handled in an unsafe manner.

**Individual Cow Work Level II – NOT TO ROPE.** This class includes a (box, fence, and drive) refer to 2009 State 4-H rule book for further explanations of class.

**Individual Cow Work Level III/IV**– This class includes a (box, fence, drive, and rope). Youth will receive a whistle and will be required to stop the pattern if at any time the rope is considered to be handled in an unsafe manner.

**Written Test** - To be taken during a break in the bleachers of the arenas. Please be sure to have a no. 2 pencil and your back number on when taking the test. Good Luck!

## WORKING RANCH HORSE DIVISION HIGH POINT SADDLES

The Colorado State Fair has graciously decided to donate 2 additional saddles to the 2010 4-H Horse Show. We have been very fortunate to have LCCC help us out in sponsoring these saddles. The State Fair 4-H Horse Show has continued to grow over the past few years and partly because of the interest in the Ranch Horse division. Therefore, we have decided to extend a thank you to all of the exhibitors who participate in the 4-H State Fair Horse Show by giving all of those that compete in the Ranch Division a chance to win a saddle.

### High Point Working Ranch Horse Rules

1. Exhibitors must compete in all three classes and the written test. If an exhibitor fails to exhibit in one of the classes they will forfeit their eligibility for the saddles.
2. The winner will be chosen by taking a cumulative placing from all four classes. The exhibitor with the highest score will win the saddle in each division.
3. Points will be calculated using the same protocol as mentioned in the "Judges and Scoring section" for all the high point awards.

**\* 2010 NEW RULE FOR SADDLE WINNERS:** Exhibitors may only win one saddle in their respective level. **Example:** Level 3 saddle winners must compete as a level 4 rider in the future to win a second saddle. They may however continue to compete as a level 3 rider, but will not be eligible to win a State Fair Trophy Saddle. Level IV riders can win a saddle more than once. (State 4-H Horse Show Committee made this rule) Please contact Bill Ekstrom or Jenny Wood for further explanation on this rule.

## Judges and Scoring

Contestants being judged by "judge A" on the English day will be judged by "judge B" on the Western day. Judges will stay in the same arena. Contestants will switch arenas after the first day (i.e. juniors showing in the west arena during the English day will show in the east arena during the western day). Refer to the show schedule to determine which arena you are showing in on which day.

The top 10-15 (at the judges discretion) contestants in the showmanship, equitation, and horsemanship classes will be called back into the ring for final placing. One judge will be used in each class. All classes will be placed through tenth. Placings will be given a point value that will be used to determine individual totals for State Champions and will be based on the number of entries. For example, if a class has a total of 10 or more entries, points will be awarded as follows: 1st -10 points, 2nd - 9 points, 3rd - 8 points, etc. 10th - 1 point. If a class has less than ten entries, points toward high point will be awarded based on the number of entries. For example, if a class has a total of 7 entries, points will be awarded as follows: 1st - 7 points, 2nd - 6 points, 3rd - 5 points, etc. High point award ribbons will be awarded through 10th place. Classes may be judged individually, in a group or in a combination. Patterns chosen for use will be left to the discretion of the judge and show management, including those using level 3 or 4 skills.

### Premiums

Premiums paid in all 4-H classes as follows:

1st - \$25; 2nd - \$20; 3rd - \$15; 4th - \$13; 5th - \$10; 6th - \$7

## County Image Award

### **Judging Criteria:**

Anonymous judges will circulate during the entire 4-H Horse Show. A committee will make inspections during the fair to determine the awards, taking into consideration the following points and rating 4-H members and country representatives in the following areas:

1. Horsemanship safety - Judges will penalize exhibitors of poor safety, including but not limited to: bareback riding, riding with halter and lead shank, more than one rider and other dangerous displays.
2. Stall safety and cleanliness. Decorations not to count.
3. Good sportsmanship
4. Courtesy to show management, judges, exhibitors and visitors.
5. Comradeship among all county representatives.
6. Accuracy in submitting entries
7. Orderliness and cleanliness of stalls, aisles and animals. Adult help is not permitted.
8. Displaying a sign or banner that designates the county. A "point of contact" for each county must be posted in each county's stalling area and must be on file in the show office. Also, each stall should have signage indicating who the owner is and what county they represent.
9. Systematic and neat arrangement of supplies, feed, hay and straw.
10. Personal appearance including award presentations and ceremonies.
11. Observance of all rules and regulations of the State Fair.
12. Cooperation with show officials, such as getting entries into the show rings on time.

### Special Awards

**Jack Janowitz Memorial and CSF High Point Level III or IV Saddle:** Dedicated to the memory of Jack Janowitz, his love of horses and the Colorado State Fair. Awarded to the Level III or IV exhibitor who accumulates the greatest overall number of points in all three divisions (English, Gymkhana, and Western). Contestants must be competing Level III or IV in BOTH English and Western to be eligible (i.e. contestants competing in Level II Western and Level III/IV English are not eligible for this award). Gymkhana points in the contestant's respective age group will also be counted. The winner will receive a saddle awarded by Mildred Janowitz, Horse Patch Farms, Franktown, CO and the Colorado State Fair.

**Barn Master High Point Level II Saddle:** Located at P.O. Box 9054 Woodland Park, CO 80866, also located on the east side of the show office during the Fair. Barn Master is sponsoring a saddle for the Level II exhibitor who accumulates the greatest overall number of points in all three divisions (English, Gymkhana, and Western ). Contestants must be competing Level II in BOTH English and Western to be eligible (i.e. contestants competing in Level II Western and Level III/IV English are not eligible for this award). Gymkhana points in the contestant's respective age group will also be counted.

**\* 2010 NEW RULE FOR SADDLE WINNERS:** Exhibitors may only win one saddle in their respective level. Example: Level 3 saddle winners must compete as a level 4 rider in the future to win a second saddle. They may however continue to compete as a level 3 rider, but will not be eligible to win a State Fair Trophy Saddle. (State 4-H Horse Show Committee made this rule) Contact Bill Ekstrom or Jenny Wood for further explanation on this new rule.
